Science-Children will be learning all about habitats and how they are suited to the animals needs.

ENGLISH

'Reading into Writing'

In English we will be putting our writing skills already learned in Autumn 1 into practice by writing sentences. We will be using our Phonics knowledge to begin to write independently.

Our Literacy writing process is very important. We work on a three week cycle. During these weeks we look at good examples of writing, the structure and language, then the children will write, edit and improve their own text.

This half term the children will be writing a diary entry, newspaper report and a letter.

MATHS

We will be concentrating on multiplication, division, shape and measure this half term.

The children will be consolidating counting in 10 and 5s and moving onto counting in 2s and 3s.
